

The first university in the Middle Ages opened in Italy. The three main subjects were law, medicine, and religion. The first medical school opened in Italy during the 800s. Skillful doctors and *surgeons were few, and they were also expensive. Most of their knowledge came from reading Greek and Arabic books. They repaired broken bones and treated patients with herbs. They used lemon oil for fevers. Another herb was good for coughs and colds. They used another one to relieve pain and to help patients sleep.

Doctors also treated teeth for rich people. Surgical tools weren't cleaned before operations. Doctors used few painkillers, so surgeries were painful. Many barbers also served as surgeons. The Black Death, the disease widely spread from 1347 to 1351, killed millions of people in the Middle Ages. It killed about 25 million people. That was about one third of Europe's total population.

The plague (the Black Death) traveled along trade routes. It was carried on ships and then spread to the land. It came to Europe on a trader ship that had sick *rats on board. The passengers and crew were already dead when the ship arrived. The plague first appeared in Italy and then spread north into France. In a few years, it had spread to Spain, England, Germany, and the Scandinavian countries in the north.

Doctors did not know what *caused the plague. Some thought bad air caused it. Later they realized it spread from one person to another. Doctors could do little to help the patients. Nothing helped once someone caught the disease. Often, even doctors died after treating patients. Because so many people died, they were put in the ground anywhere. Death rates were higher in towns than in the countryside. Sixty percent of the people in the city of Venice died.

Almost everybody knows that the Eiffel Tower in France is very famous and that it attracts so many tourists every year. It was designed by Gustave Eiffel.

In 1855, after graduating from school, Eiffel started working for a company in the South West of France. There, he built many railway bridges using metal and he became famous not only in France but in the world. Because of his success and interests, he founded a company, which specialized in metal *construction. Using metal for construction is popular today, but in those days, rocks were mainly used to build buildings.

Do you know that Eiffel was deeply involved in another very famous *structure in the world? It is the Statue of Liberty, which was given to the USA for the centennial memorial of independence. A French sculptor, named Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi, designed the Statue of Liberty. The statue is made of bronze, and it is such a big *sculpture that he needed a very strong structure inside to hold its weight. So Bartholdi asked Eiffel to design the metal structure inside. The metal structure had to be perfect because the Statue of Liberty was a gift from France to the United States, and they couldn't make any mistakes that could damage the statue. Eiffel made a strong structure, but some say that Eiffel wasn't too happy because no one could see how beautiful the metal structure was. Eiffel wanted to show people how beautiful metal construction could be.

For the International Expo in France in 1889, the French government wanted to build the tallest tower to show the world how good their technology was. In those days, using stones was still the usual way. But Eiffel told people that it took a lot less time and was easier to build a metal tower.

The Eiffel Tower was built in only 26 months, and thousands of people who came to the International Expo enjoyed and were amazed by the beauty of the Eiffel Tower. But it was going to be destroyed twenty years after the Expo. When the time was almost up, an idea was suggested to use the Eiffel tower for military communication. After some experiments, the Eiffel Tower was able to send radio waves all around Europe. This is the reason why the Eiffel Tower was not destroyed then, and it still stands as one of the most popular tourist spots in France.
